# A New Path to Peace Two Independent States – One Shared Homeland

The brutal October 7th attack on Israel, and the catastrophic violence in Palestine that has followed, have laid bare the urgent need for a just and lasting resolution to the Israeli Palestinian conflict.

**For generations, Israelis and Palestinians have been trapped in zero-sum choices that have delivered neither peace nor security.**

A Land for All: Two States, One Homeland charts a bold new course—rooted in history, anchored in equality, and driven by a deep sense of shared belonging. We are working toward a future where two sovereign states—Israel and Palestine—share one homeland through a framework of confederation. This vision transforms a painful legacy of division into a powerful foundation for partnership and peace.

## What The Two States One Homeland Model Offers

**Our confederation model embraces the vision of a shared future, including:**

- **Two sovereign states** based on the 1967 borders, with full independence, sovereignty, and equal status.
- **A shared Jerusalem**, capital of both states, with a joint municipal regime to manage shared interests.
- **A just solution for refugees**, including avenues for legal residency in Israel and compensation.
- **A pragmatic solution for Jewish settlers**, allowing them to choose to remain in Palestine as residents, subject to local law.
- **Freedom of movement** for all Palestinians and Israelis, gradually extended across the entire land, as trust and cooperation grows – and backed by security arrangements that protect both peoples.
- **Joint institutions**, inspired by frameworks like the EU, that respect the independence of each state while enabling cooperation on issues that transcend borders, including the environment, economic development, and other aspects of shared life.

## A Model Both Pragmatic and Visionary

The assumptions behind the Oslo Accords – rigid geographical separation, massive settler evacuation, and emotional detachment from deeply held historical and identity ties – have proven unworkable.

What's needed now is the courage to acknowledge a simple truth: both Israelis and Palestinians are profoundly connected to the land, even as each seeks self-determination. Our lives are intertwined – emotionally, historically, and through the practical realities of daily life. Two million Palestinians are citizens of Israel. More than half a million Jewish settlers live in the West Bank. Jewish and Muslim holy sites stand side by side. We share aquifers, power grids, labor markets, and security concerns.

Denying this interdependence has only deepened instability. Recognizing it is not an act of idealism – it is a pragmatic necessity.

**The path forward lies in affirming both separate sovereignty and meaningful connection – not walls, but bridges.**

## Who We Are

**A Land for All: Two States, One Homeland** is a joint Palestinian-Israeli movement – powered by an expanding organizational infrastructure – created by the people who, every day, live the reality of the conflict.

**What sets us apart is not just the boldness of our vision, but the integrity with which we pursue it. Our leadership embodies the future we seek, co-created and co-led by Palestinians and Israelis.** From our binational Board to our Co-Executive Directors – May Pundak, Israeli, and Rula Hardal, Palestinian – our structure reflects our fundamental commitment to equality and partnership.

## What We're Building – Together

**We are rapidly becoming a powerful voice – in Israel, Palestine, and internationally – for a vision both possible and necessary.**

### Public Engagement in Israel & Palestine

We hold scores of local public events monthly and appear regularly in Israeli and Palestinian media. We are now launching more extensive public engagement campaigns, based on public opinion polling, to inspire belief in the collective power to shape a different future. We contrast fear and cynicism with brave, clear and hopeful narratives, illustrating that a resolution is not only essential, but possible.

### Research and Policy Development

We are building a network of local, regional, and international scholars, researchers and policy experts. We're already partnering with institutions such as the Van Leer Jerusalem Institute, University College London, and UCLA to develop joint research and policy proposals – with more collaborations on the horizon.

### Regional and International Advocacy

We are forging global alliances. Our vision is generating growing engagement from governments in the region, the European Union, international policy institutions, and the media. We are building on this momentum through presentations at high-level forums such as the Munich Security Conference and the United Nations. As we expand our global outreach, we have formed a strategic partnership with the International Peace Institute.
